What is AAATE ? Association for the Advancement of Assistive Technology in Europe

The AAATE is the interdisciplinary pan-European organisation concerned with all aspects of assistive technology. This includes the use, research, development, manufacturing, supply and provision of assistive technology. Members of the AAATE are committed to the association's mission: to simulate the advancement of assistive technology for the benefit of people with disabilities, including elderly people.

Assistive technology is any product or technology based service that enables people with functional limitations in their daily lives, education, work or leisure. This includes technology for rehabilitation and education, for overcoming activity limitations and participation restrictions and for the enhancement of abilities.

Consequently the interest of our members is in enabling solutions (mainstream and special technologies and environments), accessibility and universal design, services and service delivery systems, including procurement and outcome measurement.



Areas of Action

The AAATE undertakes activities to:

- promote research and development of assistive technology and related services
- facilitate the exchange of knowledge and collaboration within the field.
- disseminate accurate information about assistive technology and related issues
- create awareness of assistive technology among all stakeholders, including policymaking bodies
- further the implementation of the UN Convention on the Rights of people with Disabilities, in particular the articles related to Assitive Technology, Accessibility, Universal Design.

Ongoing Activities


Some of the specific activities of the AAATE include:

- A major international conference held every 2 years – on all aspects of assistive technology
- "Technology and Disability", the official Scientific Journal of AAATE (Published by IOS Press)
- Seminars,workshops and information days
- A regular newsletter for members
- A Web site with a reserved area for the members
- Liaison with other international



organisations, such as RESNA, RESJA, ARATA an EASPD, bodies of the European Union, end user and industry groups in pursuit of its mission

- A network of national contacts throughout Europe
- Co-operation on wider international level with key organisations in the field.
